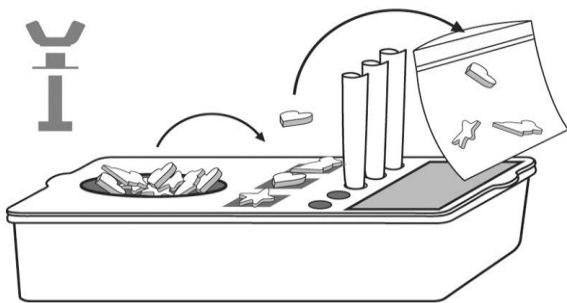


TASK 23 - MATCH, ASSEMBLE, & PACKAGE



Two distinct packaging activities can be introduced to your student depending on the level of ability. Match, Assemble and Package teaches organization through the use of visual structure.

The more basic activity requires the student to match the starfish, heart, and rabbit to their corresponding image on the lid inset, place these items in a zip-lock bag, and put the finished product in the space provided.

The advanced activity involves the student matching the bolt, shoulder-washer, and wing-nut to their corresponding image on the lid inset, assembling these parts as one unit, placing the assembly in a zip-lock bag, and putting the finished product in the space provided.

For the student who is able to match, assemble, and package the items, alternating the two activities will help promote flexibility and alleviate boredom.

Note: We encourage adaptations to this task by creating new assembly and packaging materials of interest that will continue to engage and challenge the student. It may be necessary to add more Velcro to the plastic insert cards should they give way when objects are matched to their image.

CONTENTS:

- (1) Shoebox base
- (1) Shoebox lid
- (1) 20 oz. container
- (5 ea.) wooden rabbit, starfish, and heart shapes
- (5 ea.) plastic bolt, shoulder washer, and wing nut
- (6) plastic cards with images of each manipulative
- (5) zip-lock bags
