

Task No. 23 A multi-step activity: matching objects to pictures, assembly and packaging.




Task No. 19 The individual matches a given order of colored blox, assembles the pieces, and puts them in the finished area.






SHAPE-UP

A one-unit stacking task that visually demonstrates the concept of counting from one to five.




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AROUND THE BLOCK

Task No. 26 Nine different colored coins are used in groups of three for matching or sequencing patterns.





BEAD PATTERNS

Task No. 36 The student removes puzzle pieces from the open side and matches them to a jig on top of the lid.






MOTIVATIONAL TASKS

Task No. 34 The student uses a wand to move magnetic washers through plastic tubes, placing them onto a wooden dowel. The curious behavior of magnets encourages concentration and fine motor control.



FLEX TUBE

Task No. 25 Visual and auditory effects created by dropping a ball into a transparent, flexible tube motivate students to complete the activity.

Task No. 31 Using two hands, the student stretches colored loops between dowels creating various patterns.




Task No. 29 Students put oversized pompoms into containers before screwing down the cap for closure.




Task No. 24 Through the action of squeezing and drawing colored water into the transparent pipette, students fill containers affixed to the lid or create works of art using an absorbent napkin.




